



Work Safety Alert Crushed by a Coach Under Repair

1. Date of Accident: August 2012

2. Place of Accident: A vehicle repair workshop in Yuen Long

3. Summary:

It is reported that a vehicle repair worker was crushed to his death when he was working underneath a coach which suddenly collapsed.

4. Work Safety Alert for Proprietors/Employers:

Proprietors/employers undertaking repair work under a vehicle should develop and implement a safe system of work which includes the following measures:

- the vehicle is parked on a hard and level surface;
- the vehicle's unlifted wheels are securely chocked;
- correct equipment such as hydraulic jacks of sufficient capacity are properly used to lift the vehicle;
- instead of jacks alone, the vehicle should be supported by suitable equipment such as axle stands located at correct contact points;
- the vehicle is sitting securely on the support stands before allowing work under the vehicle;
- the lifting jacks and support stands are regularly checked and maintained in good order;





- workers are properly trained and have the relevant knowledge and experience; and
- an effective monitoring and supervision system is in place to ensure compliance with the above measures.
