



Work Safety Alert Electric Arc Welding Work in Vehicle Repair Workshop

- **1. Date of Accident :** July 2012
- 2. Place of Accident : A vehicle repair workshop in Tai Po
- 3. Summary :

It is reported that a worker was suspected to have electrocuted while conducting electric arc welding work to the chassis of a lorry.

4. Work Safety Alert for Proprietors/Employers :

To avoid the risk of electrocution in undertaking electric arc welding work, proprietors/employers should ensure that:

- a competent person is appointed to conduct a risk assessment and formulate safe working procedures for the electric arc welding work;
- the electric arc welding equipment is well designed and constructed, and properly maintained;
- welding cables are properly placed and protected;
- direct contact with live parts of the electric arc welding equipment and workpieces is avoided;
- the work environment is free from accumulation of water;
- suitable personal protective equipment is provided and used by the workers;





- workers are properly trained and have the relevant knowledge and experience; and
- adequate management control and effective supervision are in place.
