



Work Safety Alert Fall through a Fragile Roof

- **1. Date of Accident :** November 2012
- 2. Place of Accident : A renovation site in Yuen Long.
- 3. Summary :

It is reported that a worker, while fixing the roof light of a single-storey structure, plunged through the fragile roof and fell a distance of about 6 metres to his death.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers :

To prevent fall from height through fragile roofs, contractors/employers should:

- conduct risk assessments and formulate safe working procedures for working over fragile roof;
- avoid working on roofs where practicable and adopt safer job methods such as working from the underneath of the roof by using a suitable working platform;
- If the work cannot be done from underneath and workers need access to the topside of the roof, use a mobile elevating work platform that allows people to work from within the basket without standing on the roof itself;
- If access onto the fragile roof cannot be avoided, install perimeter edge protection and use stagings on the roof surface to spread the loads; otherwise provide suitable fall protection devices and exercise effective supervision to ensure the workers make full and proper use of the fall protection devices so provided;





- display prominent warning notices to alert workers of the fall hazard; and
- implement effective monitoring system to ensure that the above safety precautionary measures are strictly followed.
