



Work Safety Alert Fall from Height while Erecting/Dismantling a Truss-out Bamboo Scaffold

1. Date of Accident: July 2012

2. Place of Accident : An industrial building in Aberdeen

3. Summary:

It is reported that a scaffolder fell to his death from 15/F to 1/F of an industrial building while he was erecting a truss-out bamboo scaffold at its external wall.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers:

To prevent falls of persons from height, contractors/employers undertaking erection/dismantling of a truss-out bamboo scaffold should:

- conduct risk assessments and formulate safe working procedures for the erection/dismantling work;
- ensure the provision and proper maintenance of suitable and adequate safe access to and egress from the scaffold;
- ensure every person who is erecting/dismantling a truss-out bamboo scaffold is wearing a suitable safety harness that is connected to a fall arresting system with an independent lifeline; and
- exercise effective supervision to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
