



# Work Safety Alert Fall through the Void of a Window Frame

1. Date of Accident: October 2012

2. Place of Accident: A building construction site in Cheung Sha Wan

## 3. Summary:

It is reported that a worker, while standing on a ladder to undertake fitting-out work, fell through a window frame (without glass panes) on 26/F of a building under construction and plunged to his death.

## 4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers:

To prevent any person from falling from height during internal fitting-out works, contractors/employers should:

- identify any hazardous conditions that may arise by virtue of the work nature and positions, and formulate relevant safety precautionary measures;
- use suitable scaffolds or working platforms with guard-rails of adequate height instead of ladders for working at elevated positions; and
- where the use of scaffolds or working platforms is impracticable, provide suitable fall protection devices and exercise effective supervision to ensure the workers make full and proper use of the fall protection devices so provided.
- post warning notices at prominent positions near any void spaces through which persons are liable to fall 2 metres or more;
