



Work Safety Alert Falling through a Void on a Cockloft

- **1. Date of Accident:** February 2014
- 2. Place of Accident: A warehouse under construction

3. Summary:

A worker was suspected to have plunged about 3 metres to his death through a void on a cockloft to the ground while he was engaged in floor laying work.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers:

To prevent any workers from falling from height, contractors/employers should:

- conduct task specific risk assessments and formulate appropriate safe working procedures;
- provide and properly maintain suitable and adequate safe access to and egress from every place of work;
- provide and ensure the use of suitable scaffolds or elevating working platforms where practicable;
- properly fence off or cover any dangerous edges, openings or other void spaces over or through which persons are liable to fall;
- provide and ensure the use of suitable fall protection devices by workers, where the use of scaffolds or working platforms or protection of dangerous edges, openings or void spaces are impracticable; and





• develop and implement an effective monitoring and supervision system ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
