



Work Safety Alert Rupture of an Inflatable Pipe Plug

1. Date of Accident: October 2012

2. Place of Accident: A construction site in Wan Chai

3. Summary:

It is reported that an inflated pipe plug inside a sewage outfall pipe suddenly ruptured during the concreting process, resulting in an in-rush of water and causing the death of one worker and injuries to two.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers:

Contractors/employers undertaking submarine sewage pipe works should:

- avoid workers entering the pipe as far as practicable;
- where worker entry into the pipe is necessary, mechanical plugs or partially water-filled plugs should be used instead of inflatable plugs;
- appoint a competent person to conduct risk assessments with regard to the in-rush of water and formulate safe working procedures;
- where an inflatable pipe plug is employed for temporary blocking of the pipe, the following measures should be adopted:
 - > use a suitable pipe plug which is designed for the purpose, of good construction, made of sound material and free from patent defect;
 - remove any sharp or projecting edges and objects inside the pipe before installation of the pipe plug;
 - > never inflate the pipe plug to a pressure that exceeds its maximum working pressure; and





- report any damage of the pipe plug to the supervisor immediately for repair or replacement.
- formulate and implement adequate contingency measures to ensure that workers working inside the pipe can be rescued as soon as possible in case of sudden in-rush of water; and
- exercise adequate monitoring and supervision to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
