



## Work Safety Alert Fall from Suspended Working Platform (SWP)

- 1. Date of Accident : June 2012
- 2. Place of Accident : A hotel in Tsim Sha Tsui
- 3. Summary :

It is reported that a cleaner fell to the ground to his death while the SWP at the roof level he was working on suddenly tilted downward.

## 4. Work Safety Alert for Owners/Contractors :

The owner of a SWP and the contractor undertaking works involving the use of the SWP should ensure that it is not used for carrying of persons unless:

- a safe system of work is in place for every type of work;
- the SWP is of good mechanical construction, fitted with all necessary safety devices for the safe operation, and free from patent defect;
- adequate arrangements are in place to prevent undue tipping, tilting or swinging of the working platform and to secure it to prevent undue horizontal movement while it is being used;
- the automatic safety devices are capable of stopping or holding the load at the slope of the working platform specified by the manufacturer;
- all parts of the SWP, including the whole of the mechanical and electrical apparatus, are properly maintained by a competent person in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions;
- the SWP is load tested and thoroughly examined by a competent





examiner before it is put into use after installation, repositioning and periodically;

- suitable and adequate safe access to and egress from the SWP are provided and properly maintained;
- every person who is on or is getting on or off the SWP is wearing a full body harness that is connected to a fall arresting system with an independent lifeline;
- every person working on the SWP has received proper training and has possessed a valid certificate of training; and
- an effective monitoring and supervision system is in place to ensure compliance with the above safety measures.
