



Work Safety Alert Trapped by a Fork-lift Truck

1. Date of Accident: February 2014

2. Place of Accident: A building site

3. Summary:

A fork-lift truck operator was trapped to death between the mast and the metal frame of the driving cabin of the fork-lift truck which was used for dumping of construction waste materials.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers:

Contractors/employers should take adequate steps to ensure the safe use of a fork-lift truck, including:

- appointing a competent person to conduct task-specific risk assessments with due regard to nature of the operation, the site layout and the work environment;
- formulating and implementing an effective safe system of work, which should, among others, ensure that:
 - ➤ the engine of the fork-lift truck is switched off with the brake applied, and the key or other activating device is removed when the operator gets off the driving cabin;
 - ➤ no access of persons to the part between the mast and its driving cabin is allowed while the fork-lift truck is in an operating condition;
 - > operating the fork-lift truck outside the driving cabin is prohibited;





- > any load is proper stacked or de-stacked; and
- ➤ the fork-lift truck and its attachments are properly maintained and in good working order;
- providing the fork-lift truck operators and workers with adequate information, training and instruction in respect of the above safe system of work; and
- implementing effective monitoring and supervision to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
