



Work Safety Alert Trapped by the Tailgate of a Truck

1. Date of Accident: December 2012

2. Place of Accident : A logistics centre in Chek Lap Kok

3. Summary:

A truck driver was trapped to his death between the tailgate and the body chassis of a truck when he was checking loads inside.

4. Work Safety Alert for Employers/ Truck Owners:

To prevent any person from being trapped by the tailgate of a truck, the truck owner and the employer responsible for cargo loading/unloading operation should:

- conduct risk assessments and formulate safe working procedures for the tailgate operation;
- ensure that safety features of the tailgate are installed and used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions/national or international standards, e.g. gradual motion of the tailgate throughout its operation and immediate stoppage of the tailgate motion when its control button is released;
- as far as practicable, equip the tailgate with suitable audio/visual signals to warn persons of the trapping hazard and tripping device to stop the tailgate operation when access of persons to the trapping zone is detected:
- not allow any person to get close to the closing nip between the tailgate and the rear end of the truck while the tailgate is being operated;





- if inspection to the truck compartment is required, ensure that the tailgate is fully opened and be stationary during the whole process;
- ensure that an effective communication system is in place among workers and the driver involved in cargo loading/unloading operation with the use of tailgate;
- ensure that the tailgate including its safety features is regularly inspected by a competent person and properly maintained to ensure its safe and efficient operation;
- display prominent warning notices to alert workers of the trapping hazards; and
- provide the workers involved with necessary safety information, instruction, training and supervision.
