



Work Safety Alert Collapse of Lifting Frame

1. Date of Accident: October 2014

2. Place of Accident: At a site for viaduct construction

3. Summary:

While a team of five workers were working on a lifting frame system, which was installed on the deck of a viaduct under construction and being under a load test, the lifting frame system suddenly broke apart and partly crashed onto the ground. As a result, one worker died and the other four sustained injuries.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers:

To ensure the safety of workers engaged in the testing and examination of a lifting appliance, the contractor/employer should:

- appoint a competent person to conduct a task-specific risk assessment;
- formulate detailed method statements, and safety precautionary measures based on the results of the task-specific risk assessment, and in conformity with the requirements set out in the relevant safety guidance notes, international standards and manufacturer's instructions;
- avoid any worker working or staying on the lifting appliance which is yet to be certified safe; if it is impracticable to do so, take adequate fail-safe measures to protect any worker who is required to work or stay on the lifting appliance;
- establish and implement an mechanical integrity program to ensure the proper design, installation and operation of the lifting appliance;





- properly maintain the lifting appliance and ensure it is in safe working order;
- provide relevant safety training, information, instruction and supervision to the workers involved; and
- establish and implement an effective monitoring and control system to ensure strict and full compliance with all the above safety measures and precautions.
