



## Work Safety Alert

# Crushed by the Lattice Boom of a Crawler-mounted Crane

- 1. Date of Accident : March 2015
- 2. Place of Accident : A civil engineering site

### 3. Summary :

A worker was crushed to death by the lattice boom of a crawler-mounted crane while it was being dismantled.

### 4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers :

To ensure the safety of workers engaged in mobile crane dismantling work, the contractors/employers should provide and maintain a safe system of work which should include, but not limited to, the following:

- appointing a competent person to conduct task-specific risk assessments;
- formulating detailed safe working procedures and appropriate safety measures, including securing the boom sections of the crane to be dismantled, with due regard to the results of the risk assessments and crane manufacturer's instructions;
- ensuring clear delineation of safety responsibilities and effective coordination and communication among the principal contractor, subcontractor(s) and also the crane leasing company, if any, for full implementation of the safe system of work;
- designating and properly barricading a zone for the dismantling work with warning notices displayed at prominent positions to prevent unauthorized entry;
- ensuring that all parts of the boom are slung from the lifting points recommended by the manufacturer and in such a way that they will not swing or become unstable;





- properly supporting the boom, e.g. by blocking, at the appropriate sections in conformity with the manufacturer's instructions/specifications to prevent undue movement of the boom during dismantling ;
- ensuring that no person stays below/within boom sections during the removal of the connection pins or other boom components;
- appointing a competent person who has been adequately trained and possesses sufficient experience in crane dismantling relevant to the particular type of crane involved to directly supervise the dismantling work;
- providing the workers involved with necessary safety information, instruction and training to ensure that all workers are familiar with the safe working procedures and safety measures; and
- establishing and implementing an effective monitoring and control system to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
