



Work Safety Alert Suspected Electrocution while Conducting Concrete Breaking Work

1. Date of Accident: August 2014

2. Place of Accident: A village house under construction

3. Summary:

A worker was suspected to have been electrocuted while operating an electric concrete breaker for carrying out concrete breaking work.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers:

To prevent electrical hazards at work, contractors/employers should:

- appoint a competent person to conduct task-specific risk assessments to identify all hazardous conditions on site, including electrical hazards and formulate appropriate safe working procedures and protective measures to combat the hazards;
- ensure that all electrical wires, connections and appliances are effectively protected, insulated and safeguarded;
- adopt effective engineering control measures through the proper use of suitable and adequate fuses/circuit breakers, residual current device for earth leakage protection and double-insulated or properly earthed portable electrical apparatus;
- conduct proactive inspection and take prompt rectification to ensure that the electrical apparatus and the associated plugs, sockets and wiring are in conformity with relevant safety standards and free from damage and faults;





- ensure workers involved have received proper training and acquired relevant knowledge and experience in using electrical apparatus.
 Safety training on electrical safety should also be conducted regularly to enhance workers' safety awareness; and
- exercise adequate management control and effective supervision to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
