



Work Safety Alert Failure of a Truck-mounted Elevating Work Platform

1. Date of Accident : February 2015

2. Place of Accident: At roadside

3. Summary:

A cleaning worker engaged in external cleaning work of a footbridge fell about 9 metres to his death while climbing out of a truck-mounted elevated work platform which had suddenly tipped and leaned on a tree.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers:

The contractors/employers responsible for the use of truck-mounted elevating work platform should :

- appoint a competent person to conduct a task-specific risk assessment;
- formulate detailed safe work procedures and safety precautions with due regard to the result of the assessment, and in conformity with the instructions given in the machine manufacturer's manual;
- ensure that the manufacturer's instructions in respect of levelling of the truck, proper extension of stabilizers and/or outriggers beams, and restriction of the elevating work platform operations within specified working range are strictly followed;
- ensure that the elevating work platform is loaded within its safe working load;
- ensure that the elevating work platform is operated by an authorized person who has adequately trained and is competent by reasons of





substantial training and practical experience;

- properly maintain the elevating work platform and ensure that it is in safe working order;
- formulate adequate procedures to deal with emergency situations;
- provide adequate safety information, instruction and training to the workers involved; and
- exercise adequate management control and effective supervision to ensure that the safety measures are strictly followed.
