



Work Safety Alert Fall through a Metal False Ceiling

1. Date of Accident: August 2014

2. Place of Accident: A residential building

3. Summary:

A building assistant, in an attempt to pick something up by stepping on a G/F sheet metal false ceiling of 4m above ground, fell through the said false ceiling and died subsequently.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers:

To prevent persons falling from fragile false ceiling above ground or similar unsafe places, contractors/employers should:

- conduct task-specific risk assessments and formulate appropriate safe working procedures with adequate safety precautions;
- strictly prohibit entering into or working on fragile false ceiling or similar unsafe places;
- if access to and working on such places are required, use suitable means of access/means of support and/or working platforms for the work;
- provide relevant safety information, instruction and training to the workers involved; and
- exercise adequate management control and effective supervision to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
