



# Work Safety Alert Fall from a Stairway

1. Date of Accident: November 2015

**2.** Place of Accident : A village house under renovation

## 3. Summary:

A worker fell to his death from an internal stairway inside a 3-storeyed village house under renovation.

## 4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/ Employers:

To prevent any workers from falling from height at stairways under construction or renovation and from sustaining head injury while at work, contractors/ employers should:

- appoint a competent person to conduct task-specific risk assessments taking into account the nature of work and the working environment to identify all associated potential hazards;
- devise and implement appropriate safety measures with due regard to the result of the risk assessments to minimize the risks exposed to the workers, such as falling hazard;
- provide and properly maintain suitable and adequate safe means of access to and egress from every place of work;
- properly fence off any unprotected sides of stairways/ edges of stairway landings over which persons are liable to fall;;
- ensure that the height of a guard-rail above the surface of the unprotected side of stairway/ edge of stairway landing is not less than 900mm and not more than 1150mm for a top guard-rail, and not less than 450mm





and not more than 600mm for an intermediate guard-rail;

- remove any objects that may create tripping hazard from the work area or otherwise have them properly placed, and maintain floors in a non-slippery condition;
- provide each worker employed on the site with a suitable safety helmet with a chin strap and take all reasonable steps to ensure the wearing of the same by the worker;
- provide all workers involved with relevant safety information, instruction and training to ensure that they are conversant with the safe work procedures and safety measures; and
- develop and implement an effective monitoring and control system to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
