



Work Safety Alert Fall through an Upper Floor Opening

1. Date of Accident : August 2015

2. Place of Accident : A building construction site

3. Summary :

A worker fell about 5 metres to his death through a floor opening while he was engaged in clearing up debris on an upper floor of a building under construction.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers :

To prevent any person from falling from height at any openings, edges or other void spaces, contractors/employers should:

- appoint a competent person to conduct task-specific risk assessments taking into account the working environment to identify all potential hazards on site, including falling hazard;
- formulate safe work method and procedures with due regard to the results of risk assessments;
- properly fence off or cover any floor openings, dangerous edges or other void spaces over or through which persons are liable to fall;
- ensure that the height of a guard-rail above the surface of the floor openings, dangerous edges or other void spaces shall be not less than 900mm and not more than 1150mm for a top guard-rail and not less than 450mm and not more than 600mm for an intermediate guard-rail; and that the height of a toe-board or other similar barrier shall be not less than 200mm.





- ensure that every covering provided for an opening shall be so constructed as to prevent the fall of persons, materials and articles; and should be clearly and boldly marked as to show its purpose or be securely fixed in position;
- provide and ensure the use of suitable fall protection devices by workers, where protection of openings, dangerous edges or other void spaces are impracticable;
- provide relevant safety information, instruction and training to the workers involved; and
- develop and implement an effective monitoring and control system to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
