



Work Safety Alert Run Over to Death by a Rubber Tyred Gantry Crane

1. Date of Accident: May 2023

2. Place of Accident: A container terminal

3. Summary:

A worker who was engaged in concrete ground resurfacing work inside a container terminal, was run over to death by a rubber tyred gantry crane ("RTGC").

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/ Employers:

To prevent workers engaged in construction work inside a container terminal from being endangered by moving plants/ vehicles particularly RTGCs, the responsible contractors/ employers should provide and maintain a safe system of work which should include, but not limited to, the following:

- appointing a competent person to conduct a task-specific risk assessment to identify all potential hazards associated with the work, taking into account the nature of work, environment, workplace layout and movement of plants/ vehicles;
- formulating safe work methods and procedures for the work with due regard to the results of the risk assessments, and following the requirements of safety legislation and relevant safety guidelines;
- segregating the construction work area from the operating zone of the RTGC;
- adopting strict access control measures to prevent any unauthorised entry of workers into the operating zone of the RTGC;





- providing and properly maintaining suitable and adequate safe means of access to and egress from every place of work;
- ensuring that every worker engaged in construction work inside the container terminal is wearing a high visibility or reflective jacket so that the worker could be easily be seen by RTGC operators;
- providing the workers involved with the necessary safety information, instruction and training to ensure that they are familiar with the safety work procedures and safety measures for the work; and
- establishing and implementing an effective monitoring and control system to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
