



Work Safety Alert Fall from Height from Flat Roof

- 1. Date of Accident : October 2022
- 2. Place of Accident : A residential estate

3. Summary :

A security guard while conducting security patrol plunged to death from the flat roof on 5/F of a residential building onto the ground floor.

4. Work Safety Alert for Proprietors/ Employers :

To prevent workers/ employees from falling from height at work, the proprietors/ employers should:

- appoint a competent person to conduct task-specific risk assessments to identify all potential hazards associated with the work, taking into account the nature of work, environment, workplace features and layout, particularly those dangerous places where workers/ employees will work and are liable to fall from height such as flat roofs;
- formulate safe work methods and procedures for the work with due regard to the results of risk assessments, and follow the requirements of safety legislation;
- provide and maintain suitable and adequate safe means of access to and egress from every place of work, and ensure their proper use by the workers/ employees;
- provide all workers/ employees concerned with the necessary safety information, instruction and training, and ensure that they are familiar with the safe work environment and safety measures; and





• establish and implement an effective monitoring and control system to ensure all safety measures are strictly followed.
