



# Work Safety Alert <u>Trapped to Death between a Forklift Truck</u> and an Power-operated Elevating Work Platform

1. Date of Accident : May 2023

**2.** Place of Accident : A tunnel under construction

### 3. Summary:

While a worker was engaging in the preparation work for towing away a broken down power-operated elevating work platform ("PEWP") on a construction site, the worker was trapped to death in-between the PEWP and a forklift truck for the towing operation.

## 4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/ Proprietors/ Employers:

To prevent any workers/ employees from being endangered while engaging in removal of mechanical plant, such as PEWP, contractors/ proprietors/ employers should provide and maintain a safe system of work which should include, but not limited to, the following:

- appointing a competent person to conduct task-specific risk assessments to identify all potential hazards associated with the removal work, taking into account the type, size and weight of the mechanical plant, and the working environment/ condition;
- formulating safe work methods and procedures for the removal operation with due regard to the results of the risk assessments;
- selecting suitable equipment which is designed for the removal operation and it should be operated according to the manufacturer's instructions;
- ensuing that the equipment is regularly inspected, tested and properly maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions in order





to ensure that it is in safe working condition before use;

- ensuring that the removal operation is performed by trained and competent operators/ workmen and under the direct supervision of an engineer/ a person who is competent by virtue of his knowledge and practical experience;
- if a towing vehicle or similar equipment is used, the operator should not leave the operating cabin while the engine is running and ignition key is on the vehicle/equipment;
- ensuring adequate lighting is provided for the removal operation;
- providing all workers/ employees involved with necessary safety information, instruction and training, and ensuring that they are familiar with the safe work procedures and the safety measures; and
- establishing and implementing an effective monitoring and control system to ensure that all safety measures are strictly followed.
