



Work Safety Alert

Trapped by a Lift Car

1. Date of Accident : November 2017

2. Place of Accident: A residential building

3. Summary:

A worker while conducting lift maintenance at a residential building was trapped between the bottom of a descending lift car and the landing entrance on ground floor. He sustained serious injuries and passed away subsequently.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers:

To ensure the safety of workers/ employees engaged in any lift maintenance work, the contractors/ employers should provide and maintain a safe system of work which should include, but not limited to, the following:

- appointing a competent person to conduct task-specific risk assessments to identify all potential hazards associated with the lift maintenance work, taking into account the nature of work to be carried out (including lift testing work), the work locations and the possible movement of the lift car;
- formulating safe work methods and procedures for the lift maintenance work with due regard to the results of risk assessments and the relevant codes of practice, industry guidelines, recognized international standards and lift manufacturer's specifications/instructions;
- implementing a permit-to-work system to ensure that all hazards associated with the lift maintenance work are eliminated before allowing any worker/ employee to enter the lift shaft/ pit for work. Among others, the following safety precautions should be taken to prevent any unintended lift car movement:





- ➤ the car top control station and all safety devices in the lift shaft/ pit, including the emergency stop switches and manual control mode switches, should be suitably tested for their effectiveness and proper functioning before the commencement of any work;
- ➤ if any person needs to enter the lift pit via the lowest landing, the emergency button located near the landing door at the lowest floor or the car stopping device located at the car top should be depressed;
- ➤ the main power supply to the lift should be turned off, tagged and locked out;
- ➤ warning notices should be displayed at both the lift pit entrance and the lift machine room indicating that work is in progress at the lift pit;
- ➤ adequate and appropriate communication means/ equipment such as mobile phones or walkie-talkies should be provided to all parties involved in the lift work to maintain effective communication:
- ensuring that the lift work is well-planned and coordinated to avoid incompatible activities being performed at the same time;
- ensuring that the lift work is conducted safely under the immediate supervision of a person who is competent by virtue of his substantial training and practical experience in relation to the relevant work;
- ensuring that only competent workers/ employees possessing adequate knowledge, skills and experience are employed to carry out the lift work;
- providing all workers/ employees, supervisors and related personnel involved in the lift work with necessary safety information, instruction and training;
- ensuring that workers/ employees, supervisors and related personnel involved in the lift work are familiar with the safe work procedures and safety measures, and fully understand their roles and responsibilities; and





 establishing and implementing an effective monitoring and control system to ensure strict and full compliance with all the above safety measures.
